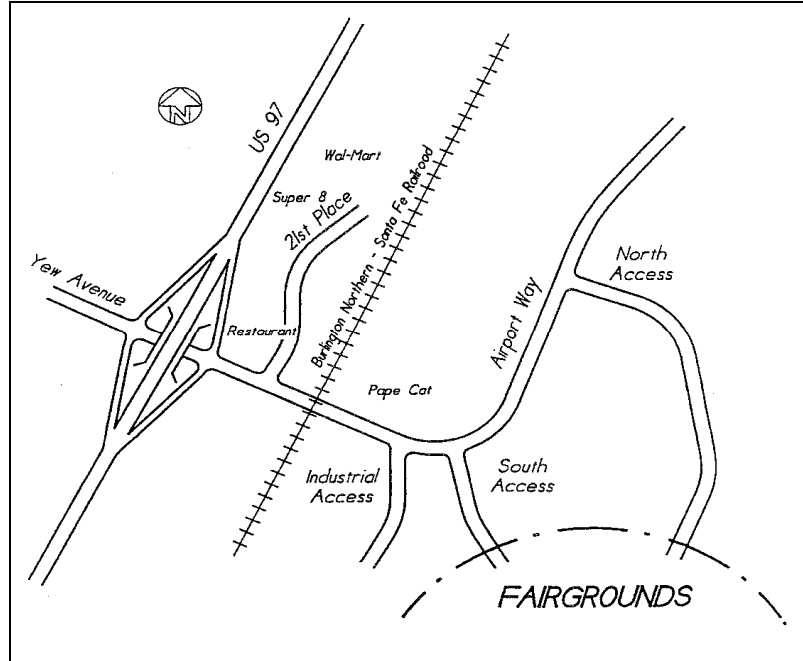

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS INTO OREGON

All horses entering Oregon from out of state (except Washington) must have an entry permit from the Oregon Department of Agriculture and a health certificate with identification. A negative EIA (Coggins) test (within 6 months prior to entry) is required for all states except Washington. There is no cost for entry permits and they are obtained from the Oregon Dept. of Agriculture, 635 Capitol Street NE, Salem, OR 97310, 503-986-4679. The Dept. of Agriculture will issue permits over the phone, but prefer that your veterinarian call with the Coggins report.

DESCHUTES COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS EXHIBITOR RULES & REGULATIONS

To assist the Show Management and to ensure a smooth and successful show, all exhibitors are asked to read and adhere to the following rules.

1. Manure pits are located behind the barns.
 - Exhibitors must wheelbarrow shavings and manure into the manure pits.
 - Keep the paved roadways & areas around the manure pits clean of straw & manure by picking up spillage.
 - Manure pits will be emptied as they become full.
 - Only shavings and manure are to be placed in manure pits.
 - Garbage cans will be provided for string, wire, horseshoes, feed bags, rubbish, etc.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD SHAVINGS AND MANURE BE PUSHED OR PLACED ONTO ANY PAVED SURFACE AREAS OR INSIDE THE BARNES.

2. Vehicles not used in an event must be **parked away from buildings** to allow for emergency access to front and back of buildings.
3. **NO HORSES ARE ALLOWED ON THE GRASS.** A charge may be assessed if damage to grass occurs or clean up is required. Exercise and work your horses in warm-up areas.
4. **DO NOT DEFACE** buildings by stapling posters, flyers or other decorations. Do not use duct, scotch or masking tape on floors or walls.
5. The **speed limit** on the grounds is not to exceed 10 mph.
6. **ALL DOGS** are to be kept on leash. Dogs are NOT ALLOWED in the buildings or on the lawn areas, except Seeing Eye, Medic Alert, 4-H show, or sport and wildlife events. Security dogs need pre-approval by fairgrounds management. WALK YOUR DOG IN THE DESIGNATED AREA ONLY AND **CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG.**
7. **NO SMOKING IN BUILDINGS** (includes restrooms).
8. **Do not block** power receptacles, fire extinguishers, emergency exits or water faucets.
9. **Remove all event materials and equipment** from buildings and fairgrounds unless prior arrangements have been made.

VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE FAIRGROUND RULES COULD RESULT IN FINES AND/OR IMMEDIATE EXPULSION FROM THE SHOWGROUNDS.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

“Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.”

USEF MEMBERSHIP RULE:

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT:

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the “Federation”) and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

A copy of the appropriate, current USEF membership card(s) must be sent with entries. If a copy of the card(s) does not accompany the entry or is not presented upon checking in, and cannot be verified at the show office, then a member must pay a \$30 non-member fee.

AMHA EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY: AMHA Life, General, Youth and Youth Life Members are eligible to participate in all classes. A non-member of AMHA may participate as a rider, driver, handler, owner, lessee, agent or trainer upon payment of a \$30 non-member fee. Classes for which membership is not required include: Leadline, Walk-Trot/Jog, Races and Exhibitions. **A copy of the appropriate, current AMHA membership card(s) must be sent with entries.**

Horses entered in Regional Shows MAY BE SUBJECT TO INSPECTION during the show by a representative of the AMHA registry. Owners and their agents are responsible for having the Certificate of Registration, or a Photostat copy, available for each horse for presentation to the inspector.

AMATEUR CERTIFICATION: Every person who has reached his 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. USEF Chapter 13. Certification must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the Competition Secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such certification provided by the Federation.

ARRIVALS & DEPARTURE: Stall fees cover the following dates ONLY: Monday, June 14th through Sunday, June 20th, 2010. If ARRIVING EARLIER than Monday or DEPARTING LATER than Sunday afternoon, you MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS with show management. There will be an early arrival fee of \$25.00 per night per stall occupied by horses. Please add this to your entry blank.

AWARDS: Trophy to first place and ribbons to eighth place will be awarded to all In-hand and Performance classes. Coolers will be presented to Division Champion and Reserve Champion. Championship cooler only to high-point winners in Dressage. Division of money classes shall be as listed below. Prize money will be distributed no later than 30 days after the close of the show.

CHANGE OR CANCELLATION: Management has the right to combine, cancel or split any classes it deems appropriate. Management reserves the right to reschedule any class for the overall good of the show, exhibitors to be notified as per USEF rules.

CLASS ANNOUNCEMENTS: Please be aware class calls are a courtesy to the exhibitor. Show management is not responsible for an exhibitor missing a class, although every effort will be made to maintain a working P.A. system.

CONDUCT: The Horse Protection Act of 1970, Public Law 91-540 as amended will be followed. Exhibitors are cautioned as to their conduct in the ring and in the schooling

areas, especially with respect to training and schooling horses. Use of all rubber or elastic devices on legs are prohibited on the show grounds before or during this show. Violators will forfeit all trophies, ribbons and premiums previously won and will be barred from any further competition, and will have absolutely no recourse against the management of this show and its officials.

DIVIDING OF CLASSES: It is at the manager's discretion to split qualifying classes of 18 or more entries. Both sections will be pinned. Championship classes being split will have a call back to pin one champion. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to check to see that they have been entered in the proper class and split section.

DRUGS & MEDICATION: In compliance with the USEF Drug and Medication Rule, a \$15.00 fee will be collected on all horses entered, including equitation horses. The Drugs and Medications fee has been incorporated into the USEF Fee and will continue to be assessed per horse, per competition. This includes the \$7.00 drug fee and a \$8.00 USEF fee. The Show Committee has requested USEF to test these shows for use of forbidden substances.

ENTRIES: MUST BE POSTMARKED MAY 14, 2010 to be included in the show program. No Dressage entries will be accepted after June 1, 2010. All entry blanks must be signed by Owner, Trainer and each Rider/Driver/Handler and Coach (if applicable). No one under 18 may sign.

ENTERING CLASSES DURING THE SHOW: Any class entered during the show must be entered ONE HOUR before the session in which the class is to be held.

CHANGE IN ENTRIES: Where exhibitors, trainers or stables wish to make a change in entries in any class, they are required to follow the procedure of scratching the existing entry and making a new entry with the Show Secretary's Office. Fees paid for scratched classes will *NOT* be refunded or credited. In the event of the sale or injury to a horse (Veterinarian's Certificate is required), exhibitors may post enter another horse in the same class.

CROSS ENTERING is allowed between Classic Pleasure Driving and Pleasure Driving or Classic Pleasure Saddle and English Pleasure. Cross entering is allowed to other sections of this show.

FACILITY AND FOOTING: Hooker Creek Show Arena is 125' x 300'; Hooker Creek warm-up arena is 100' x 200'; Sagebrush Arena is 150' x 300'. Footing is volcanic soil and sandy loam in all arenas with the exception of Sagebrush arena which has barkdust added.

FEED AND BEDDING: Please order by May 15 to guarantee shavings. Several mills have closed due to the economy and shavings are hard to get.. *Please note:* The **ONLY** approved supplier is K & D Shavings, 541-383-3194. Please contact them directly to make arrangements for your bedding.

PAYMENT WILL BE MADE DIRECTLY TO THE SUPPLIER AND NOT PAID THROUGH THE SHOW OFFICE.

Additional shaving and feed orders can be placed during the week from K&D Shavings on the showgrounds.

GOLF CARTS: : Rentals are available through the horse show only. You may order them on the entry blank. Order deadline is June 7, 2010.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind; including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 7. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE: opens Tuesday, June 15th at 1:00 p.m. The office telephone number is 541-504-5626.

PERSONS NOT IN GOOD STANDING: PERSONS WHO ARE NOT IN GOOD STANDING WITH AMHI OR AMHA may not participate in this show, whether as an exhibitor, owner, trainer or otherwise. This policy includes all horses registered in the name of any such person, whether leased or under contract for sale. Procedures have been established to resolve any disputes concerning accounts with AMHI or AMHA. Entries for persons having a debt to any other Regional show or the Grand National & World Championship Morgan Horse Show® may be refused until indebtedness is settled.

POST ENTRIES will be accepted after the closing date at no additional cost. No post entry fee will be charged for classes entered at the show if they are entered at least one hour before session in which the class is held. **UPON PAYMENT OF A \$50.00 FEE, in addition to the class entry fee, entries will be accepted up to the time the class is entering the ring.** THERE WILL BE NO DRESSAGE ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 1, 2010.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Riders in all classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds must wear protective headgear (Exception: Trail classes). All juniors riding in Hunter Seat Equitation sections, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear in any division or class without penalty by the judge.

PROTESTS: As per USEF Chapter 6, Protests may be made to the Show Committee by an exhibitor, owner, agent, trainer or the parent of a junior exhibitor for any violation of USEF rules. It must be in writing, signed by the protester, addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the alleged violation occurred, accompanied by a deposit of \$200.00 (\$300 if made by a non-member) and received by the steward, technical delegate, a member of the Show Committee, the competition manager or the competition secretary within 48 hours of the alleged violation.

REGISTRATION: Morgans shown must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Assn. Inc., or the Canadian Morgan Horse Association or the British Morgan Horse Society and must be entered under their full registered name and registration number, or if under one year of age, be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or leasee of record with AMHA, CMHA or BMHS. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry.

RESPONSIBILITY: All exhibitors in the horse show will be under the control and direction of the Show Management and said Management will not be responsible for loss, injury or damage to horses exhibited or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or in anyway damaged. You may report lost articles to the Show Secretary.

SHARPS DISPOSAL: It is the responsibility of each individual stable to properly dispose of needles, syringes and other bio-hazardous materials. Sharps containers will be placed in the barns. Please use them to dispose of these items.

STALLS/STABLING: Permanent and portable stalls with doors will be available. Bedding is the responsibility of the exhibitor and may be pre-ordered by the official supplier.

There will be a charge for any stall damage. Nailing, drilling or poking holes in panels or frames is NOT ALLOWED.

Stall assignments will be made at the sole discretion of the show management.

INDIVIDUAL EXHIBITORS REQUESTING TO BE STABLED WITH A TRAINER MUST BE IN TRAINING WITH THAT TRAINER, AND HAVE THE TRAINER SIGN THE STABLING LIST AND SIGN THE ENTRY.

TRAILERS/ HORSE VANS: EMPTY HORSE TRAILERS must be parked in designated areas only. Please cooperate so we don't have to tow your trailer to a new location.
