## PACIFIC NORTHWEST SHOW RULES

1. ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY APRIL 16, 2010 AND JULY 19th, 2010. POST ENTRIES may be made up to two classes before the class to be entered at a \$5.00 additional charge. All penalty fees will apply to entries postmarked after above dates. THIS A DEPARTURE FROM OUR PREVIOUS POLICY SO BE AWARE. Management reserves the right to accept entries for unfilled classes at the regular fee. All fees must be paid in U.S. dollars. Checks returned for insufficient funds will be charged a \$35.00 handling fee and must be replaced by money order or cash. Entry fees will be refunded only upon signed certificate from Veterinarian presented to the show Secretary prior to the first class in which the horse is entered. A \$30.00 office charge will be made on all cancelled entries. Office will be open continuously, beginning one hour before the beginning of each morning performance and closing 15 minutes after the conclusion of the last class in each day. Post Entry Fees do not apply to AMHA Medal Classes.

2. STABLING: Permanent and portable box stalls with full or half doors will be available at a rate of \$90.00 per stall for the show or \$45.00 for a single day. Tack stalls will be available at a rate of \$90.00 per stall for the show. Horses may arrive Thursday afternoon and must depart by noon Monday. Anyone showing from their trailer must pay a \$15.00 clean-up fee per horse per day. Those requiring stabling for a longer period of time MUST make arrangements with the show secretary. Stabling fees will be refunded only if stall is resold. Horse Hotel @ \$25.00/day/stall applies for those arriving Wednesday.

3. SHAVINGS: First Bedding will be furnished. Additional shavings will be available for purchase @ \$9.00 per bale (or market price) at the show office. This is the information available at time of printing but is subject to change. BRING YOUR OWN BEDDING IF POSSIBLE to save \$.

4. Stall chart and phone number for veterinarian on call will be posted at the show office.

5. RV- hookups are available at \$75.00 for the show or \$25.00 a night. Dogs will not be allowed on the grounds unless they are leashed - City Ordinance.

6. TROPHY/RIBBONS: Trophy & Ribbons to six places in all classes except Junior Exhibitor classes and Championship classes, which will be awarded a trophy and eight ribbons. In-Hand Show Champions will receive appropriate perpetual and annual trophies and ribbon. Reserve Show In-Hand Champions will receive appropriate ribbon. In performance classes in which perpetual trophies are awarded, winners will receive an accompanying "Keeper" trophy and appropriate ribbon. PURSES: \$100.00 purses pay to 4 places: \$40.00, \$30.00, \$20.00, \$10.00; \$200.00 Purses to 5 places: \$60.00, \$50.00, \$40.00, \$30.00, \$20.00.

7. The US Equestrian Federation rules governing all classes will apply in this show, and persons 17 years of age and under are eligible for Amateur classes. Cross entry permitted between English Pleasure and Classic Pleasure & Driving as long as shoeing meets appropriate requirements

8. Prize money will be paid by check and presented at the show or mailed within 20 business days after conclusion of the show at the discretion of show management.

9. If, during a class, an exhibitor wishes to be excused from the class, the exhibitor must ask the judge for permission to be excused before he/she may leave the ring.

10. A novice horse or rider is one who has not won 3 blue ribbons in their division. A Limit horse is one who has not won 6 blue ribbons in their division. A junior horse is four years and under.

11. NO DOGS IN GRANDSTANDS, PLEASE

12. Indoor arena 195' x 95', footing is dirt, covered warm-up arena 144' x 60' footing is sand, outside arenas are sand.

**USEF Rules do not require the inclusion of full judging specifications in prize lists and programs of approved shows, except classes not listed in the USEF Rule Book. See general rules in the front section of this material and refer to current USEF rules for Morgan and Friesian competition.**

### VERSATILITY AWARD

Rules for competition:

1. Exhibitor must register the horse for the Award on the entry blank. 2. The horse must enter at least five different categories 3. The horse may enter as many classes as desired, but only the highest placing in each category will count toward the Award. 4. Points will be tabulated as follows: 1st-one pt for each horse shown, 2<sup>nd</sup>, one less, 3<sup>rd</sup>, one less, etc. Example: For a class with five entries: 1<sup>st</sup> 5 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup>-4 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup>-3 pts, etc. 5. A tie will be resolved in favor of the horse with the most first place awards, second place awards, etc.. Categories in which horses may earn points are as follows: Combination (ride/drive and Hunter/Western), Hunter Pleasure, English Pleasure, In-Hand, Sport Horse In-Hand, Musical Freestyle, Pairs, Natural Park Saddle (if offered), Pleasure Driving, Road Hack, Bridle Path Hack, Sidesaddle, Trail Horse, Western Pleasure, Classic Saddle, Classic Driving, Carriage Driving, Hunter Hack and Dressage Suitability. Masters and Walk-Trot Pleasure may be used to meet English, Driving, Hunter or Western Pleasure requirement. Equitation including leadline, Walk-trot Eq. & Showmanship earns one point for participation if the rider places. Horses competing for the Versatility Award must be entered in the appropriate space on the front of the entry blank or nominated at the show prior to their first class to count for points.

### PNW SPRINGTIME SHOW

**FRIESIAN HIGH POINT HORSE AWARD:** A Champion Rosette and prize will be presented to the Friesian or Part-Bred Friesian horse accumulating the most points in Friesian and OTAB classes throughout the show. Points will be tabulated as for the Morgan Versatility Award

## FOUR AWARDS WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE HIGH POINT MORGAN JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

Four High-Point Junior Exhibitor Awards will be presented, one cooler each for Hunt Seat, Western, Saddle Seat (Saddle Seat to include Classic.) and Walk- Trot. Jr. Exhibitors may show in all classes and all seats that they wish, but they may sign up for a High Point Award in only one seat, or walk-trot and must sign up and declare which classes they are entering for points before the first class of the show.

### Classes to count are:

**HUNT SEAT:** Trail, showmanship, equitation at age level (not medal), pleasure at age level, and any other hunter seat classes at the show.

**WESTERN SEAT:** Trail, showmanship, equitation at age level (not medal), pleasure at age level, and any other western seat classes at the show.

**SADDLE SEAT:** Trail, showmanship, equitation at age level (not medal), pleasure at age level, and other English classes at the show including the Classic division.

**WALK-TROT:** Showmanship, Equitation all seats, Pleasure all seats.

**POINTS:** Points for equitation, showmanship and championships will count 8 for 1st, 7 for 2nd, etc. Points for all other classes will count 5 for 1st, 4 for 2nd, etc. A tie will be resolved in favor of

the exhibitor with the most first place awards, second place awards, etc., and if still a tie by the toss of a coin.

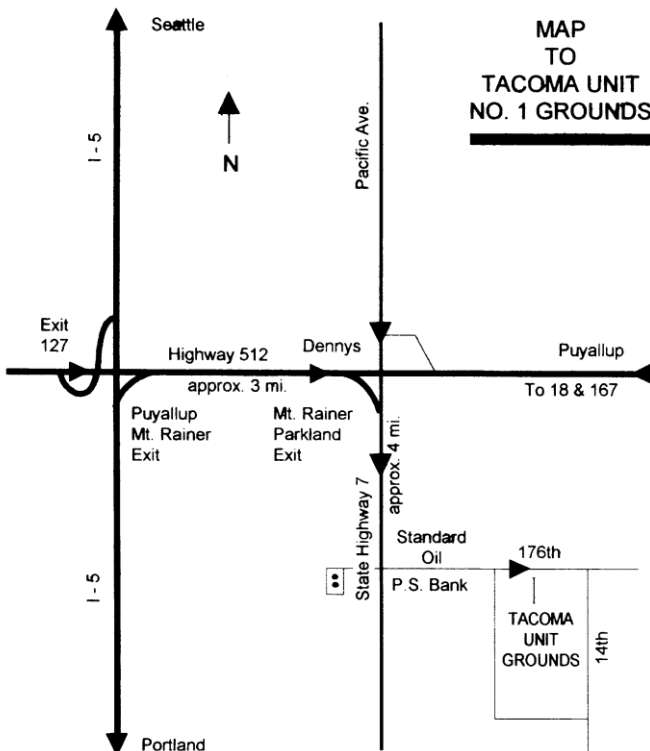
The oral and written tests will take place after the last class in the Saturday afternoon performance, Nancy Eidam will be in charge.

This class is based on the “Original” Morgan type and will be judged using the Morgan Standard of Perfection from 1952 and the visual image of the original George Ford Morris portrait of Justin Morgan.

A pleasure class for beginning riders 11 years and under. Hunter Seat or Saddle Seat tack and appointments. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Not to canter. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. No cross entry with any class to canter in this show. Riders must not have cantered in any prior competition regardless of rating.
- 22. Walk-Trot Equitation, Western  
A horsemanship class for beginning riders 11 years and under. Western Seat tack and appointments. To be shown both ways of the ring at walk and trot. Not to canter. Judged on seat, hands, and general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. Header optional. No cross entry with any class to canter in this show. Riders must not have cantered in any prior competition, regardless of rating.
- 41. Walk-Trot Equitation, Hunt Seat or Saddle Seat  
Same specifications as class 22. Hunter or Saddle Seat tack and appointments. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot.
- 66. Walk Trot Western Pleasure  
Same specifications as class 16. Western tack and appointments. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and jog trot.
- 94. WALK-TROT WESTERN EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible riders must have been entered, shown and judged in class 22.
- 116. WALK-TROT ENGLISH EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible riders must have been entered, shown and judged in class 41
- 121. WALK-TROT WESTERN PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible horses must have been entered, shown, and judged in Class 66.
- 129. WALK-TROT HUNTER & ENGLISH PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible horses must have been entered, shown, and judged in Class 16.

To be eligible riders must have been entered, shown and judged in classes 31 or 37.
- 110. Adult Amateur Equitation—See USEF MO 163
- 126. ENGLISH EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP.  
To be eligible riders must have been entered, shown and judged in classes 20, 26, 46, or 64.

#### **TRAIL HORSE CLASSES**

- To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, jog/trot, lope/canter of suitable duration to determine way of going (with the exception of In Hand and Walk/Trot). To be judged on performance with emphasis on soundness.

- 35. TRAIL HORSE \$100. CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible, horse must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 34.

#### **ROAD HACK CLASSES**

- To be shown at a walk, trot, road trot, canter, hand gallop both ways of the ring and to back readily. At any time during the class the judge may ask horses to halt and walk off on a loose rein. Excessive speed at the hand gallop should be penalized. To be judged on performance with proper cadence and balance, manners and suitability for a road hack 60%; type and conformation 40%
- 25. Road Hack, Hunt Seat
- 47. Road Hack, Saddle Seat
- 111. ROAD HACK \$100. CHAMPIONSHIP  
To be eligible, horses must have been entered, shown and judged in 25 or 47.

#### **CARRIAGE DRIVING CLASSES--OTAB**

- 89. Carriage Pleasure Driving-Working--OTAB  
A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle. 10% on neatness of attire. Refer to USEF Rule CP128
- 90. Carriage Driving Reinsmanship--OTAB  
A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. . . .Refer to USEF Rule CP129
- 91. Carriage Obstacle Driving Time Competition—OTAB  
To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. After passing the starting line, driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and add to the driver's elapsed time. Placings determined on a low total time basis with ties decided by a drive-off. Refer to USEF Rule CP152

#### **MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES—ALL OTAB**

- 54. **Musical Freestyle Ride.--OTAB** 4 minute ride to music, all seats, creativity encouraged, non-traditional attire permitted
- 63. **Executive Pleasure Saddle--OTAB**  
A pleasure saddle class for non-professional riders 39 years and older, all seats with appropriate equipment and attire.
- 68. **Pairs Walk-Trot Pleasure--OTAB**  
A pair of horses to compete side by side at the walk and trot both ways of the ring to be judged on uniformity of gait, precision, performance, manners and appearance including tack and attire. A simple pattern may be requested by the judge.
- 75. **Hunter Pleasure, Amateur Owned, Trained & Shown--OTAB**, Horses not to have been professionally trained in current competition year nor presented, prepared, groomed or schooled by a professional before or during the competition. Owner must sign as owner, trainer and rider on entry blank. See for further information: MO 178.16
- 76. **Sidesaddle Pleasure--OTAB**  
Open to Park or Pleasure section horses. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, jog/trot and lope/canter. Judged on manners, performance and quality 50%; appropriate sidesaddle attire 15%; type and conformation 35%.
- 80. **Bridle Path Hack, Hunter Type--OTAB**  
To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop. To back easily and stand quietly while rider dismounts and mounts. Emphasis is placed on actual suitability to purpose.
- 85. **Partners Pleasure Saddle--OTAB**  
One rider to show the first way of the ring at the walk, trot and canter, their partner to show the second way of the ring at the walk and trot only. All seats with appropriate tack and attire are permitted.
- 87. **Western Pleasure, Amateur Owned, Trained & Shown—OTAB**, See specifications for class 75, above and MO 178.16
- 95 **Combination Pleasure Horses, Ride/Drive--OTAB**  
Rider & Driver may be different. To be shown first in harness both ways of the ring at the walk and trot, then under saddle both ways at the walk, trot and canter. Carriage and pleasure section horses welcome
- 98. **Walk-Trot Pleasure Saddle, Adult Amateur--OTAB**  
A pleasure saddle class for adult amateur riders, all seats, tack and attire appropriate to seat. Horses to walk and trot both ways of the ring, stand quietly. Judged on manners, performance, suitability. Cross entry permitted with canter classes for novice riders, Executive and Amateur Masters only
- 102. **Combination Pleasure Saddle Horses, Western/English (Hunt or Saddle Seat)--OTAB**  
To be shown both ways of the ring in Western tack and attire at the walk, jog and lope, then both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter. Rider may be the same (best effort on appropriate attire) or different.

### **108. Aged Horse Pleasure Saddle—OTAB**

A pleasure saddle class for horses 15 years and older, all seats with appropriate tack and attire are permitted

### **110. Adult Amateur Equitation—OTAB**

All seats with appropriate tack and attire are permitted.  
See USEF MO 163

### **113. Dressage Suitability--OTAB**

Open to horses who have not competed in any test above the first level that are under seven years of age. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a Dressage mount. See USEF for dressage approved bits.

### **118. Leadline --OTAB**

Mares and geldings only. Open to beginning riders at least two but less than seven years of age. To be led by an adult (18 & over). To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk only. It is required that equipment fit the rider with rider's feet in the stirrups. Judged on seat, hands, and general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. No cross entry to any other ridden/driven class in the show. See MO 178 #17

## **FRIESIAN DIVISION**

Horses shown in this division must have been issued a membership certificate from International Friesian Show Horse Association (IFSHA) confirming verification of Friesian heritage and identity with IFSHA or have an application applied for IFSHA Recognition at the competition. Refer to FR 101.2. Horse Owners/lessees competing in Purebred & Part-Bred Friesian USEF licensed competitions must be members in good standing with the International Friesian Show Horse Association (IFSHA). In order to compete, horse owners/ lessees must provide a copy of their IFSHA membership card and a copy of the horse's IFSHA membership certificate with entry form at the time of making entry prior to the competition, presenting to the competition office at the time of entry or by applying for their membership card and horse membership certificate at the competition, but before the competition number will be released.

Individuals signing the USEF Entry Agreement (i.e. rider, driver, handler, agent of an owner, and trainer) for horses competing in the Friesian division must be members of IFSHA or pay to IFSHA a non member fee for each competition in which competing. Horse owners/lessees must be members of IFSHA as required in FR101.1a. Exception: When a parent/guardian is signing for a minor, they do not have to be IFSHA members or pay the IFSHA non-member fee.

Any Friesian bred horse regardless of color, height and/or registry that can prove its Friesian heritage and identity is eligible to compete provided that the horse and the horse's owner/lessee are IFSHA members in good standing, and the horse has been issued an IFSHA membership certificate or application applied for through the competition office. Horses and/or horse owners/lessees can make application for membership to IFSHA at a USEF licensed competition provided that the following items are given to the competition secretary prior to the release of the competition number. (1) IFSHA Membership application or membership card for horse owner/lessee (2) IFSHA Membership application for horse (3) Payment in full (4) Proof of Friesian Heritage, which shall include a copy of the horse's breed registry registration certificate. (5) Proof of Permanent Identification (IFSHA Equine Identity Record form must be completed if proof of identification does not appear on the horse's breed registration certificate). See FR101.3.

IFSHA membership forms for horse and horse owner/lessee

can be located on the IFSHA web site at [www.friesianshowhorse.org](http://www.friesianshowhorse.org) under "Join IFSHA." A horse's Equine Identity Record form can be found in the IFSHA "Forms Library" section. IFSHA is responsible for notifying USEF if an IFSHA membership application for horse and/or owner taken at the competition is not in compliance. All horses must have a permanent identification mechanism. Acceptable forms of identification are freeze marks, tattoos, brands, tongue codes or RFID micro chips that can be verified back to the horses breed registry certificate, or a certification of administration by a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine. IFSHA and its assigns reserve the right to validate identification of a horse at any time, inclusive of DNA verification by mane or tail hair sampling. All horses must be registered with a foreign or domestic registry that maintains proof of Friesian heritage through DNA testing and record maintenance. IFSHA and its' assigns reserve the right to validate the horse DNA at the horse owner's expense in the event that a protest or grievance has been filed with IFSHA and/or the USEF. Part-Bred Friesians must have at least 50% pure Friesian blood and one pure blood Friesian parent (exception: horses that have competed in any Friesian and Part-bred Friesian Division class at a Federation licensed competition prior to January 1, 2006.)

The following information is a general summary of descriptions and guidance's that are not all inclusive of the rules and regulations that govern each class. For complete information on each class please refer to the current USEF Handbook, or [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org) under Sub-Chapters FR-1 through FR-21. (Notice to USEF Horse of the Year Participants: Any class that has less than three entries will earn half points instead of full points. See USEF GR1113.2c & GR1127.2. Notice to IFSHA Horse of the Year Participants: IFSHA will reward full points regardless of number of class entries.)

Horses must be serviceably sound and in good condition. Purebreds should be shown in their natural splendor with full mane, tail and feathering. Part-Breds should be shown in their natural splendor with full mane and tail. Part-Breds leg hair may be clipped from the back of the coronary line to the upper cannon bone. See USEF FR101.
