PNW Morgan Horse Show Rules and Prize List

GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION

1. For exhibitor convenience, entries are to be submitted via email to the show secretary. Entry blank and payment instructions can be found at the end of this document, or as a separate document on the show website at pacificnorthwestmorganhorseshow.com.

Instructions on filling out the online entry form: The entry form is interactive and will calculate fees as you enter information. First, make sure your Adobe is the most current. Save the forms to your desktop, tab through the form, filling in the information. When finished, save and attach to an email to our show secretary (peprmntpatii@g.com). If entering another horse, save a copy of the first entry and then over type the horse name and any information which is different. Remember to "save" often. Title each file using the horses name, put into a zip file and attach it to email. Be sure to fill in the two release forms and send those as well. USEF requires the Waiver of Liability from each person involved with the horse. Electronic signatures are acceptable. If you have questions, feel free to phone the show secretary at 253.279.6722.

Entry packets will not be given out until entry fees are paid. Post entries may be made up to two classes before the class to be entered at a \$5.00 additional charge. All penalty fees will apply to entries postmarked after above dates. Management reserves the right to accept entries for unfilled classes at the regular fee.

All fees must be paid in U.S. dollars. **For your convenience, we will now be accepting electronic payment/credit card payment through PayPal. Please note that PayPal users will add an additional 3% user fee.** Checks returned for insufficient funds will be charged a \$35.00 handling fee and must be replaced by money order or cash. Entry fees will be refunded only upon signed certificate from Veterinarian presented to the show Secretary prior to the first class in which the horse is entered. A \$50.00 office charge will be made on all cancelled entries and this will be applied to a class sponsorship in the exhibitor's name. Office will be open continuously, beginning one hour before the beginning of each morning performance and closing 15 minutes after the conclusion of the last class in each day. Post Entry Fees do not apply to AMHA Medal Classes.

2. **Membership Requirements:** Due to our designation as a USEF **Local show**, it is no longer required that competitors be members of USEF or pay a non-member fee. Those competing for Horse of the Year must still provide membership information.

All exhibitors must be members of AMHA or pay the non-member fee! Proof of membership is required with entry.

3. **Stabling:** Permanent and portable box stalls with full or half doors will be available at a rate of \$155.00 per stall. Tack stalls are available at the same rate. Dressage stalls will be available for one night only at a rate of \$60.00 per stall.

Arrivals prior to 12pm on Wednesday, August 24th will incur a \$30/stall horse hotel charge, charged by the facility, NO EXCEPTIONS. All early arrivals must be confirmed with show management. **Similarly, those staying at the facility beyond August 28th will incur a \$30/stall horse hotel charge, charged by the facility, NO EXCEPTIONS.** All late departures must be

confirmed with show management. Anyone showing from their trailer must pay a \$25.00 clean-up fee per horse per day. Those requiring stabling for a longer period of time **must** make arrangements with the show secretary. Stabling fees will be refunded only if stall is resold. **DO NOT dump water buckets in stalls. Stalls where water buckets have been dumped out will have a \$50/stall fee assessed by the Tacoma Unit. DO NOT leave nails/other metal hanging objects in stalls. Stalls left with nails will have a \$25/stall fee assessed by the Tacoma Unit.**

4. Shavings: **First bedding will not be provided by the Tacoma Unit.** Shavings will be available for purchase at market price at the show office. This is the information available at time of publication but is subject to change. **Competitors are encouraged to bring their own bedding.** Straw bedding is prohibited.

5. Stall chart and phone number for veterinarian on call will be posted at the show office.

6. RV- hookups are available at \$37.00 a night. Any vehicles or trailers blocking an RV hookup will incur the \$37/night fee. **NEW FOR 2022: The Tacoma Unit will be charging for dry camping as well. The rate for dry/non-RV camping will be \$12/night. All vehicles parked around the RV hookups on the designated power poles will incur an RV hookup fee as assessed by the Tacoma Unit WHETHER THEY ARE USING THE POWER OR NOT. To avoid this fee – PLEASE do not park near the RV hookups unless you intend to use the power and are paying the RV fee.**

7. TROPHY/RIBBONS: Trophy and ribbons to six places in all classes except Junior Exhibitor classes, which will be awarded eight ribbons. In-Hand Show Champions will receive appropriate perpetual and annual trophies and ribbon. Reserve Show In-Hand Champions will receive appropriate ribbon. In performance classes in which perpetual trophies are awarded, winners will receive an accompanying "keeper" trophy and appropriate ribbon.

8. The US Equestrian Federation rules governing all classes will apply in this show, and persons 17 years of age and under are eligible for Amateur classes. Cross entry permitted between English Pleasure and Classic Pleasure & Driving as long as shoeing meets appropriate requirements.

9. USEF Vaccination Rule (GR845) eff. 12/1/15: All horses on the grounds must have current vaccinations for flue and rhino. Exhibitors **MUST** have proof of vaccination in their possession for each horse at the show.

10. If, during a class, an exhibitor wishes to be excused from the class, the exhibitor must ask the judge for permission to be excused before he/she may leave the ring.

11. A novice horse or rider is one who has not won 3 blue ribbons in their division. A Limit horse is one who has not won 6 blue ribbons in their division. A junior horse is four years and under.

12. Dogs will not be allowed on the grounds unless they are leashed, per City Ordinance. Dogs are not allowed in the grandstands.

13. Indoor arena 195' x 95', footing is dirt, covered warm-up arena 144' x 60' footing is sand; dressage arena is 20 X 60 Meters; outside arenas are sand.

14. Safe Sport: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

15. USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

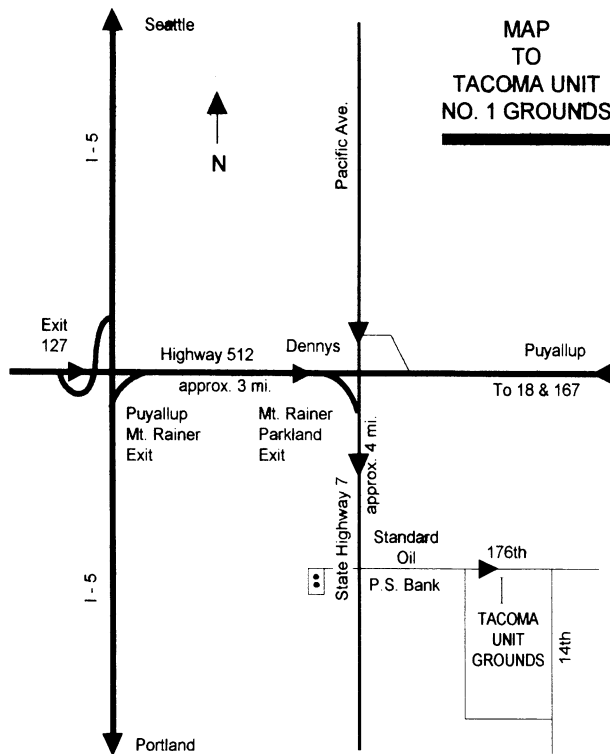
USEF Rules do not require the inclusion of full judging specifications in prize lists and programs of approved shows, except classes not listed in the USEF Rule Book.

VERSATILITY AWARD

Rules for competition:

1. Exhibitor must register the horse for the award on the entry blank.
2. The horse must enter at least five different categories
3. The horse may enter as many classes as desired, but only the highest placing in each category will count toward the award.
4. Points will be tabulated as follows: 1st – one point for each horse shown, 2nd – one point less, 3rd – one less, etc. Example: For a class with five entries: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 4 points, 3rd = 3 points, etc.
5. A tie will be resolved in favor of the horse with the most first place awards, second place awards, etc.

Categories in which horses may earn points are as follows: Combination (ride/drive and Hunter/Western), Hunter Pleasure, English Pleasure, In-Hand, Sport Horse In-Hand, Musical Freestyle, Pleasure Driving, Road Hack, Bridle Path Hack, Sidesaddle, Trail Horse, Western Pleasure, Classic Saddle, Classic Driving, Carriage Driving, Hunter Hack, Disciplined Rail, Dressage, Western Dressage and Dressage Suitability, Reining, and Ranch Riding. Masters and Walk-Trot Pleasure may be used to meet English, Driving, Hunter or Western Pleasure requirement. Equitation including Walk-trot, Equitation & Showmanship earns one point for participation if the rider places. Horses competing for the Versatility Award must be entered in the appropriate space on the front of the entry blank or nominated at the show prior to their first class to count for points.

HIGH POINT MORGAN JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

Four High-Point Junior Exhibitor Awards will be presented, one each for Hunt Seat, Western, Saddle Seat (Saddle Seat to include Classic.) and Walk-Trot. Jr. Exhibitors may show in all classes and all seats that they wish, but they may sign up for a High Point Award in only one seat or walk-trot, and must sign up and declare which classes they are entering for points before the first class of the show.

PNW MORGAN HIGH-POINT HORSE AWARDS

High point awards will be awarded to five horses earning the most competition points for the entire weekend; one each in the Hunter, Western, English, Driving, and Dressage divisions. The Catherine Cloud perpetual trophy will be awarded to the rider earning the highest score in traditional dressage (excluding introductory level). All classes in appropriate attire to count.

This class is open to any age or sex, not to exceed 15.1 hands and a maximum hoof length of 4 & 1/2" including shoe & pad will apply. One handler only, no whips allowed, to lead entry into the ring single file at a walk. Horses are to be judged individually, each standing square, and at the walk. Entries MAY be jogged at the judge's request along the rail and must be serviceably sound. This class is based on the "Original" Morgan type and will be judged using the Morgan Standard of Perfection from 1952 and closest resemblance to the statue of Justin Morgan located at Weybridge, VT. MO 202.19.

MORGAN SPORT HORSE IN-HAND

May be split further by age if entries warrant.

Sport Horse specifications see General Rules section of book and MO 178, Sport Horse In Hand classes to be judged on the line, on the triangle individually at a walk and trot. Horses

two and over must be shown with a snaffle bit.

MORGAN DRESSAGE

All dressage classes at the show will be using the current USEF/USDF tests or revisions. The PNW Morgan Horse Show is a USEF Level 2 Dressage Competition. Dressage tests will be performed in the main indoor arena in a 56.7m x 20m Court. A competitor who does not enter the arena within 45 seconds after the entry bell is rung for his/her ride shall be eliminated. Tests may be called during the competition. Announcing the test is limited to reading the movement as it is written, once only. Unauthorized assistance by anyone is prohibited and is cause for elimination. Per USEF regulations, numbers must be worn at all times during the day of competition when a horse is being exercised or ridden. A horse and rider combination may enter each class one time only. Riding Test times will be sent via e-mail prior to the beginning of the show. Entries in this section are limited and must be in the hands of the show secretary by the closing date. Post entries for Dressage will only be accepted as scratches and availability allow. The Show Management reserves the right to reject any entry, as well as cancel or combine classes as necessary. Management also reserves the right to change the order of the classes as they are listed in the prize list. Competitors in affected classes will be notified.

To be shown both ways of the ring in Western tack and attire at the walk, jog and lope, then both ways of the ring in English tack and attire at the walk, trot and canter. Rider may be the same (best effort on attire) or different.

127. Costume Class

To walk only, to be judged on creativity, ingenuity, artistic execution.

135. Walk-Trot Adult Amateur Pleasure

A pleasure saddle class for adult amateur riders, all seats, tack and attire appropriate to seat. To walk and trot both ways of the ring, stand quietly. Judged on manners, performance, and suitability. Cross entry with canter classes for novice riders, Executive and Amateur Masters only.

144. Musical Freestyle Ride

4 minute ride to music, all seats, creativity encouraged, non-traditional attire permitted.

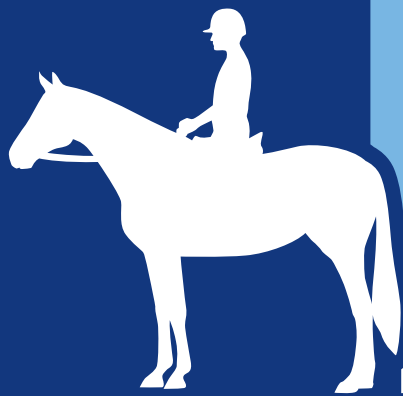

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
